

The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a *Minor Basilica* by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's *Coat of Arms* presents a shield sheltered by the *ombrellino*, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin - *every eye shall see him.*

RCIA

The *Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults* will begin in the Fall. This process is the usual way for non-baptized adults to enter the Catholic Church through Baptism, Confirmation and First Eucharist. A weekly series of reflections will be offered to assist them in discerning the Lord's call to faith in their lives. Adults baptized in other Christian denominations may also join us for this process. JOHN 6 The Introductory Rites

The title of the first part of the Eucharistic celebration helps us understand what is happening in these opening moments. The Church community has gathered in its house and the celebration begins by the union of many

voices singing the processional hymn. We know that to get to this moment involves our own home rituals of getting ourselves and others ready. Arriving at Church we are greeted and we greet our friends and neighbours. Perhaps we tell a bit of our story of the past week. After taking our place in a pew we take some time to reflect. The singing of the processional hvmn brings us together as a worshipping community. The procession of ministers makes its wav through the Assembly - a beautiful sign of the whole Church at prayer. After the hymn, the Priest makes the Sign of the Cross and greets us with a formal liturgical greeting. We are invited to acknowledge our sins and we implore the mercy of God. On solemn feasts and most Sundays of the year (except Advent and Lent) we sing the song of God's glory. After the singing the Priest invites us to pray. In the silence after that invitation we can recall our own intentions. Then the Priest prays the Collect, an opening prayer in the name of the gathered assembly. We are now ready to listen attentively to the Word of God.

A few tips to help us prepare for Mass ...

- Read the Scripture readings early in the week and use them in your daily prayer.
- Make the Lord's Day Sunday a day of rest for you and your family. Place a priority on activities that re-create and re-fresh.
- Give yourself enough time to arrive a bit early at Church. Try to avoid arriving just as Mass begins, or after it has begun.
- Let go of unnecessary cares and concerns.
- Greet others in a warm and friendly way we are all praying together!

CATHEDRAL IS OPEN

During the months of July and August the Cathedral Basilica will be open to receive visitors who wish to view it or who wish to take time to pray. We will open from 10:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. Greeters will be available in the Cathedral to assist those who are visiting and to answer questions about the Cathedral Basilica.

SOME INSIGHTS FROM Laudato Si

Pope Francis' recently issued Encyclical Letter – *Laudato Si: On the Care of our Common Home* – focuses on a number of important themes:

- ➤ The ecological crisis, Pope Francis writes, is a summons to profound interior conversion to renew our relationships with God, one another, and the created world.
- ➤ God created the world and entrusted it to us as a gift. Now we have the responsibility to care for and protect it and all people, who are part of creation. Protecting human dignity is strongly linked to care for creation.
- ➤ We are connected to the rest of the human family, to the created world, and to those who will come after us in future generations.
- ➤ People in poverty have contributed least to climate change, yet they are disproportionately impacted by it. As a result of excessive use of natural resources by wealth nations, those who are poor experience pollution, lack of access to clean water, hunger and more.
- We are one human family and have a shared responsibility for others and for creation. Wealthy countries have a responsibility to reduce consumption of non-renewable resources and should help poorer nations develop in sustainable ways.
- Concern for nature is incompatible with failure to protect vulnerable human beings –

the unborn, disabled, or victims of human trafficking.

What can I do?

- Become more aware of our interconnectedness – our lifestyle and decisions have an impact on others.
- Changes in our lifestyle and consumption habits can have a positive impact ... re-usable water bottles, shorter showers, walking or biking, composting and the use of energy efficient appliances.
- Support local farmers by purchasing their produce.
- Find out what is happening in local community groups that are working for justice.
