The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a *Minor Basilica* by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's *Coat of Arms* presents a shield sheltered by the *ombrellino*, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin - *every eye shall see him*.

CONFIRMATION AT THE CATHEDRAL

Young people from our Parish will celebrate the *Sacrament of Confirmation* on **Saturday, December 6th, 2014** at 5:00 p.m. Mass. Grade 7 students from Canadian Martyrs School ... as well as any Grade 7 student whose family attends our Parish can celebrate the Sacrament with us this year. Registration packages will be available through the School and at the Parish in September. A Parent Meeting will take place in October. Catechetical sessions for the candidates, as well as a Retreat day, will be held at the Cathedral in November to help these young people prepare well for the celebration of Confirmation.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

Any unbaptized adults who wish to become members of the Catholic Church are invited to speak with Father Wynen by contacting the Parish Office. Adults baptized in other Christian churches or baptized Catholics who have not been Confirmed may also wish to speak with Father about completing their Initiation into the Catholic Church. Our process begins in September.

Summer series ...

The Eucharist

The liturgy is the “source and summit” of the Christian life – so says the *Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy*, #10. At Sunday Mass we experience the high point of our week and source from which the Lord’s grace flows into our lives. For Catholics the celebration of Sunday Eucharist is essential to living a fully Christian life.

“The Eucharist is the very sacrifice of the Body and Blood of the Lord Jesus which he instituted to perpetuate the sacrifice of the cross throughout the ages until his return in glory. Thus he entrusted to his Church this memorial of his death and resurrection. It is a sign of unity, a bond of charity, a paschal banquet, in which Christ is consumed, the mind is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory is given to us.” (Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, #271)

Each time we gather for the Mass we share in the “once for all” sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross and we share in the food that brings us life. We acknowledge the presence of Christ in the Mass in four distinct ways – in the *people* gathered, in the *Word* proclaimed, in the *Priest* who serves, and most uniquely in the bread and wine which become his Body and Blood. *“Jesus Christ is present in the Eucharist in a unique and incomparable way. He is present in a true, real and substantial way, with his Body and Blood, with his Soul and Divinity. In the Eucharist, therefore, there is present in a sacramental way, that is under the Eucharistic species of bread and wine, Christ whole and entire, God and man.”* (Compendium, #282)

The Mass flows from the Table of the Word to the Table of the Eucharist. We begin with the *Introductory Rites* which form us into a worshipping community. In the *Liturgy of the Word* we hear the story of God’s saving works in human history. Often passage from the Old Testament are proclaimed with a Psalm refrain. The second reading is taken from one of the *Letters* of the New Testament. A Gospel reading – often related in theme to the first reading – is proclaimed by the Deacon or Priest and then a homily is preached. Our response to this proclamation of God’s Word is the *Profession of Faith* and the *Universal Prayer* (petitions).

The Table of the Eucharist is prepared by placing bread and wine upon it. The Priest invites us to lift our hearts and voices in the great prayer of thanks. The simple bread and wine become the very Body and Blood of the Lord for our nourishment and strength. After praying the *Lord’s Prayer*, we make our way to the Table and receive Holy Communion and the Mass concludes with the dismissal.

Let us pray that our weekly celebration of the Eucharist continue to be our strength and help.

WEEKLY ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Please note that we have weekly Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on **Saturdays** from 3:30 p.m. until 4:30 p.m. Perhaps you might consider taking this hour for quiet prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. Among our intentions during this weekly Holy Hour let us pray for vocations to the ordained Priesthood and consecrated Religious Life. Let us also pray for all deacons, priests, bishops and religious men and women that God may continue to deepen their experience of joy in serving the Church.

FATHER MURRAY FARWELL

Our Diocesan family mourns the loss of Father Murray Farwell – a long-serving Priest of the Diocese of Hamilton – who died on July 7th. After many years of distinguished service as a military chaplain, Father Farwell was Chaplain General of Canada. Upon retirement from the military he was appointed Pastor of Saint Mary Parish in Mount Forest. He is mourned by family, parishioners and his brother Priests.

ONTARIO COLLEGE OF PHYSICIANS & SURGEONS

Doctors in Ontario currently have the right to decline to provide non-emergency care that does not conform to their own moral and/or religious beliefs. This allows them to opt out of non-emergency care referrals, such as abortions, emergency contraception and other medical care that violates their own conscience. The College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario (CPSO) is now reviewing their Human Rights Code policy; the new policy will provide guidelines for physicians practicing medicine in Ontario. There is pressure on the CPSO to include language in their policy that would require doctors to offer or refer patients for such non-emergency care, forcing them to go against their own personal beliefs. The CPSO is accepting feedback on their website until August 5th


