

The Most Reverend D. DOUGLAS CROSBY, OMI, DD *Bishop of Hamilton*

The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a *Minor Basilica* by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's *Coat of Arms* presents a shield sheltered by the *ombrellino*, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin - *every eye shall see him*.

ASCENSION OF THE LORD

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. Near the end of the Easter Season the Church recalls the promise of Jesus to never abandon his disciples ... rather he promises the Advocate who will be with us always. This feast prepares us for the celebration of Pentecost (June 8) and the conclusion of the Easter Season. In some places the Ascension is celebrated on Thursday (May 29), but in Canada the Feast is moved to Sunday to allow the faithful to share in the joy of this day.

PREPARATION FOR FIRST EUCHARIST

Please pray for the children and parents who are participating in the final preparation for the reception of Our Lord in Holy Communion. They will be meeting with our Pastoral Minister – Sandra Gould – for the next several weeks. We will have the joy of sharing in their first Holy Communion on Sunday, June 22 at the 11 a.m. Mass.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY

There has been an expression of interest in restarting the Children's Liturgy of the Word at Sunday Mass. In order for this to happen we will need some parent volunteers who would lead the sessions on a rotational basis. It would provide an opportunity for children aged 4 to 7 to celebrate the Liturgy of the Word and then re-join their parents for the remainder of the Mass. Parents who are interested may contact Father Dave at the Parish Office. Training will be provided and volunteer screening (including an updated Police Records check and vulnerable sector screening) is required.

RCIA INQUIRY

MUSIC IN THE LITURGY

Our Catholic liturgy has a very rich tradition of liturgical music. At the Cathedral we are richly blessed with excellent choirs under the direction of Robert Corso.

Song is an integral part of the celebration of the Eucharist and the other liturgical rites of the Church. Saint Augustine reminds us that when we sing we pray twice!

The Second Vatican Council (1962 – 1965) encouraged the *full, active and conscious* participation of the lay faithful in the liturgy. Singing, word, gesture and silence all help us to participate well.

The principal congregational sung parts of the Mass are (in order of importance) the *Communion hymn*, the processional hymn, the Eucharistic acclamations, and the responsorial psalm. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal makes no provision for the "recessional hymn" although this has become a strong custom in North America.

At the Cathedral our cantors always invite the Assembly to join in singing – either by announcing the hymn number or by gesturing for a response – please follow their cues and sing!

SUMMER MONTHS

One of the great gifts of living in Canada is the joy of all the seasons of the year. After a long and cold winter we now have the gift of beautiful summer days. As the days grow longer and warmer, there may be a temptation to skip Sunday Mass. Join us for the celebration of Sunday Mass each week – or attend where you are staying for holidays. Our participation in Sunday Mass is an integral part of being a Catholic. We want to offer our very best for the Lord at Sunday Mass and this includes the way we dress. The Cathedral is air conditioned so we encourage people to dress respectfully and modestly when participating in Sunday Mass.
