The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a *Minor Basilica* by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's *Coat of Arms* presents a shield sheltered by the *ombrellino*, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin - *every eye shall see him*.

CONFIRMATION AT THE CATHEDRAL

Young people from our Parish will celebrate the *Sacrament of Confirmation* on **Saturday, December 6th, 2014** at 5:00 p.m. Mass. Grade 7 students from Canadian Martyrs School ... as well as any Grade 7 student whose family attends our Parish can celebrate the Sacrament with us this year. Registration packages will be available through the School and at the Parish in September. A Parent Meeting will take place in October. Catechetical sessions for the candidates, as well as a Retreat day, will be held at the Cathedral in November to help these young people prepare well for the celebration of Confirmation.

Summer series ...

The Sacrament of Baptism

Baptism is the first of the *sacraments of initiation* by which children or adults become full members of the Catholic Church. Together with *Confirmation* and *Eucharist*, the Sacrament of Baptism welcomes new members into the Body of Christ – the Church.

For Catholics, the Sacrament of Baptism is usually celebrated in the church by the parish Priest or Deacon. In a danger of death situation any baptized Christian – intending to do what the Church does in baptism – can baptize. We celebrate Baptism with the pouring of water on the head and the invocation of the Holy Trinity – “*I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.*”

Baptism can only be celebrated one time. The Catholic Church recognizes the baptismal celebrations of other Christian churches who use water and the words of the baptismal form in their ritual.

The Sacrament of Baptism is like a “gateway” to the sacramental life for a Christian. It sets us apart for *mission* and *conforms* us to Christ. Through our Baptism we share in Jesus’ *priestly, prophetic, and sovereign* mission.

In the celebration of Baptism we are anointed with *Sacred Chrism*. This mixture of olive oil and precious balm is consecrated by the Bishop at the annual Mass of Chrism celebrated each year in the Cathedral. It is used to anoint the heads of the newly baptized and confirmed, the hands of Priests and the heads of Bishops in their ordination. It is also used to anoint the Altar and walls of a Church at its dedication. The anointing with Sacred Chrism is a sign of being set aside for the mission of Christ lived as a member of the Church. The newly anointed become a living sign of Christ’s presence and a beacon radiating the warmth of His light to others.

Sacred Chrism, together with the other oils blessed each year at the Chrism Mass – the Oil of the Sick and the Oil of Catechumens – are kept in the *Ambry* near the Baptismal font.

The Paschal or Easter candle is the large candle which is lighted from the new fire blessed at the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday. It remains lighted throughout the celebrations of the Easter Season – near the Ambo – a sign of the light of the Risen Christ which dispels the darkness of our world. The Paschal candle is lighted during baptismal celebrations and funerals. May the light of Christ, rising in glory, guide us through this life to eternal life!

The font itself is important. It is a sign of our belief in the importance of baptism in the Christian life. A significant font reminds us of the reality of our baptismal call each time we pass by it. As we are unable to take water from the baptismal font when we enter the Cathedral there are small receptacles at the doors with holy water. Often we bless ourselves with holy water as a reminder of our baptism and its call to discipleship in our lives.

In the history of the church, the shape and location of the baptismal have taken many forms which are reflective of the local community’s understanding of baptism. Many traditional fonts consisted of a shallow pool accessed by three steps into the font – representing our death in Christ through baptism – and three steps to exit the font – our rising to new life through the waters of baptism. In many churches, built in our Catholic tradition, the baptismal font takes a cruciform or cross shape. The cross of the Lord with which we are signed and sealed is the path to life.


