WELCOME!

The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a Minor Basilica by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's Coat of Arms presents a shield sheltered by the ombrellino, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin - *every eye shall see him*.

WHAT'S BACK?

Recent relaxation of COVID restrictions mean that we can return to a more normal pattern of Parish life. The Cathedral is open at "full capacity" - there is still plenty of room for distancing. Our Cathedral Choir will return - with limited numbers - on Easter Sunday at 11:00 a.m. Their ministry supports the singing of the assembly and will continue for the Easter Season. We will soon begin recruiting Altar Servers - children in Grade 4 and older as well as young people - may volunteer for this important ministry. Training will take place in the Spring. The Cathedral Basilica will host several Diocesan celebrations this Spring and we look forward to welcoming Catholics from across our Diocese to our "mother Church."
