WELCOME!

The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a *Minor Basilica* by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's *Coat of Arms* presents a shield sheltered by the *ombrellino*, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin - *every eye shall see him*.

Ordinary Time

The liturgical season known as "Ordinary Time" resumes this week with the 7th Week in Ordinary Time. There are 34 weeks of Ordinary Time in the liturgical year. Each year the season is paused by the observance of Lent & Easter. The next two Sundays are the observance of two important feast days in the life of the Church -Holy Trinity and the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi). These feasts help us deepen our faith in God and in the Holy Eucharist. The usual colour for the Sundays of Ordinary Time is green - a symbol of our Christian hope. May these days of Ordinary Time strengthen our faith and lead us closer to the Lord.

CHAPTER 5: SPIRITUAL COMBAT, VIGILANCE AND DISCERNMENT

Evil is present from the very first pages of the Scriptures. We should not dismiss the devil as a myth, a figure of speech or an idea, lest we let down our guard and end up more vulnerable. Our path towards holiness is a constant battle for which the Lord equips us with prayer, the word of God, the celebration of Mass, Eucharistic adoration, sacramental Reconciliation, works of charity, etc.

The path of holiness is a source of peace and joy, given to us by the Spirit. How can we know if something comes from the Holy Spirit, not from the spirit of the world or the devil? By discernment, which differs from intelligence and common sense. The gift of discernment is all the more necessary today because contemporary life proclaims so many distractions as equally valid and good.

Discernment is a grace. It is not only for the more intelligent or better educated. It requires no special abilities, but it does require listening: to the Lord and to others, and to reality itself, which always challenges us in new ways. Listening frees us to set aside our own partial or insufficient ideas, our usual ways of seeing things. We need to discern God's timetable, lest we disregard his invitation to grow. For this reason, I ask all Christians to examine their conscience daily in sincere dialogue with the Lord.

We need the silence of prolonged prayer to better perceive God's language, interpret the real meaning of the inspirations we believe we have received, calm our anxieties and see the whole of our existence afresh in God's own light.

Our attentive discernment entails obedience to the Gospel as the ultimate standard, but also to the Magisterium that guards it, as we seek in the treasury of the Church for whatever is most fruitful for the "today" of salvation; for rigidity has no place before the perennial "today" of the risen Lord.

God asks everything of us, yet he also gives everything to us. He does not want to enter our lives to diminish them but to bring them to fulfilment. Let us ask the Holy Spirit to pour out upon us a fervent longing to be saints for God's greater glory, and let us encourage one another in this effort. In this way, we will share a happiness that the world will not be able to take from us.

Mary Mother of the Church

On Monday, May 21 we celebrate, for the first time, the obligatory memorial of Mary, Mother of the Church. This feast which Pope Francis instituted earlier this year is to be celebrated annually on the Monday after Pentecost. It recalls the title given to Our Lady by Blessed Pope Paul VI during the Second Vatican Council (1962-In the Council document, Lumen Gentium 1965). (Constitution of the Church), the Blessed Mother is spoken of in the final chapter. She is described as the first disciple of the Lord and mother of the Church. The teaching of the Council echoes the long held Catholic belief about Mary, the Virgin Mother of the Lord Jesus. On the Cross the Lord entrusted the care of his mother to Saint John, and entrusted him - and through him all believers – to her maternal care.

Later this year, at the end of the Synod on Youth and Vocations, Blessed Pope Paul VI will be canonized a Saint, together with Blessed Oscar Romero and others. This will be a great day in the life of the Church as we seek the intercession of these modern day Saints. Pray for us!
