The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a *Minor Basilica* by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's *Coat of Arms* presents a shield sheltered by the *ombrellino*, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin - *every eye shall see him*.

Mass will be offered each day for the intentions of our parishioners, especially for an end to the pandemic. Funerals are limited to 10 persons (including the Priest). Graveside prayers will be offered at this time. A memorial Mass can be scheduled for family and friends once the orders are lifted. All baptisms will be delayed until we re-open (except for emergencies). The Sacrament of Reconciliation may be requested

by appointment only. Thank you for your understanding and co-operation during this difficult time.

ORDINARY TIME

The Season of Easter ends today with the great Feast of Pentecost – the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples fifty days after the Resurrection of the Lord. We pray for a fresh outpouring of the same Holy Spirit on us in our present day. It is the Holy Spirit who is our consoler, comforter, and strength in our weakness. Let us pray for the gifts of the Holy Spirit in our own lives so that we may bear the fruits of the Spirit.

The *Season of Ordinary Time* resumes on Monday, May 24 – with the feast of Mary, Mother of the Church. This is a great feast to celebrate the day after Pentecost. It recalls Mary's important role in the early Church and the fact that she remains with the Church today as a powerful intercessor.

There is nothing ordinary about Ordinary Time. The title comes from the fact that the Sundays are numbered – we resume in the 8th week in Ordinary Time. The Season concludes with the *Feast of Christ the King* on the 34th Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Two upcoming feasts focus our attention on two central mysteries of our Catholic faith – the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity (May 30) and the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ (June 6). We observe these feasts as Ordinary Time resumes to help focus on the fact that our whole lives are lived with the Trinity – God – Father, Son and Holy Spirit; and that the Holy Eucharist is the source and summit of our lives.

May these feasts and the Sundays of the year renew the faith in us and strengthen us to live it each day!
