The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a Minor Basilica by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's Coat of Arms presents a shield sheltered by the ombrellino, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin - every eye shall see him.



SAINT PAUL VI

Friday, May 29th is the feast day of Pope St. Paul VI (1897 – 1978) served as Supreme Pontiff from his election in 1963 until his death on August 6, 1978. Pope Paul presided over the Second Vatican Council which was begun during the Pontificate of Pope Saint John XXIII. Pope Paul also oversaw the implementation of the Council, a work carried on by his successors up to our current Holy Father, Pope Francis. Pope Paul began working in the Vatican's Secretariat of State as a young Priest. In 1954 he was appointed the Archbishop of Milan and became known as the "workers' Archbishop." Known for his gentleness, charity and love for the Church, he was canonized by Pope Francis on October 14, 2018. Saint Paul VI, pray for us!

A quote of Saint Paul VI regarding the Sacred Liturgy: "For if the sacred liturgy holds first place in the life of the Church, then the Eucharistic Mystery stands at the heart and centre of the liturgy, since it is the font of life that cleanses us and strengthens us to live not for ourselves but for God and to be united to each other by the closest ties of love."
