The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a Minor Basilica by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's Coat of Arms presents a shield sheltered by the ombrellino, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin - every eye shall see him.

Special Collection

His Excellency Bishop Crosby has asked all Parishes in Hamilton Diocese to participate in a special collection to assist Catholic agencies in the Diocese of Hamilton who were not able to sign the Federal Government's attestation to receive Canada Summer Job grants. These agencies include the Catholic Youth Organization. Students provide valuable assistance as councellors at Camp Brebeuf and Camp Marydale. These camps provide residential and day camp experiences for children from across the Diocese. Catholic agencies were not able to sign the attestation because it conflicts with the Church's teaching on issues around abortion, reproductive rights and euthanasia. Respect for all human life from conception until natural death - is a core belief for Catholics that we cannot sign away. The collection will be taken at all Masses. You may use envelopes provided at Mass next weekend. Thank you for your generous assistance which will be used to fund these student jobs at CYO and other Catholic agencies who have not signed on to the Federal Government's required attestation.

Corpus Christi

We celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi – the Body and Blood of Christ – next Sunday. This feast is an opportune time to review our practices around the reception of Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist.

FAST – we are encouraged to fast from food and drink (except water) for one hour before receiving Holy Communion.

CONFESSION – if we are aware of serious, or even mortal sins, we should celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

DISPOSITION – we should recognize the immense gift given to us in the Eucharist and the privilege we have of sharing in it.

How to receive?

The reception of Holy Communion is governed by particular law established by the Canadian Conference of Bishops and by the local Bishop. In his recent Pastoral Letter on the celebration of the liturgy in the Diocese of Hamilton, Bishop Crosby reminds us of how we are expected to receive Holy Communion at Mass. Namely, as we approach the minister distributing Holy Communion – usually as the person in front of us is receiving – we make a *simple* bow of the head in reverence for the gift we are about to receive. There is no need to genuflect or make a profound bow. Then, **standing** before the minister, there are two ancient ways for receiving Holy Communion – in the hand or on the tongue. The minister, holding up the Sacred Host says, *The Body of Christ*, and we say - audibly - "Amen." Then we either open our hands or our mouth to receive. If we receive in our hands we immediately take the Sacred Host and place it in our mouth. We do not take the Sacred Host with us to our pew.

Communion to the Sick

If you wish to take Holy Communion to a relative who is sick at home please speak with Father Wynen prior to Mass – there is a special container and prayers for Communion to the Sick.

Reverence for Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament

When we pass in front of the Tabernacle, or go into our pew, it is customary to *genuflect* or bow in reverence. At the Cathedral Parish we have the custom of the whole assembly standing as the Blessed Sacrament is reposed in the Tabernacle after the distribution of Holy Communion. All are seated when the Tabernacle doors close.

Communion Hymn

After the proper parts of the Mass, the most important opportunity for communal singing in the Catholic Mass is the *Communion Hymn* which begins once the Priest has received and continues until the distribution is completed. All are invited to sing.

Cathedral Basilica Open

We will be opening the Cathedral Basilica on weekdays (Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday) from 11:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. for the summer months beginning this week. This is an opportunity for visitors to see the Cathedral and also a time for folks who would like a quiet place to pray. Information about the Cathedral will be available and a guide will assist visitors with any questions.
