#### **WELCOME!**

The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a Minor Basilica by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's Coat of Arms presents a shield sheltered by the ombrellino, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin - every eye shall see him.

#### ADVENT IS HERE

The liturgical Season of Advent is a brief fourweek period of preparation for the great celebration of Christmas. In our culture - and sometimes in our own minds - it is overshadowed by Christmas. It is an important time of Catholics. The Church's liturgy for Advent focuses, initially, on the coming of Christ in glory in the fullness of time. At the midpoint of Advent the emphasis shifts to the birth of the Messiah in Bethlehem 2,000 years ago. The liturgy for these four Sundays offers us a welcome break from the hustle and bustle of the season. These liturgies guide us gently onward to prepare our hearts and homes for the Saviour's birth. The First Sunday of Advent (November 27) is the start of a new liturgical year. We move into the "Year A" cycle of readings. The Gospel - on most Sundays - will be taken from the Gospel of Matthew. Perhaps a good way to prepare for Advent would be to read the Gospel of Take a chapter each day and prayerfully ponder the life and teaching of the Lord Jesus. You may want to begin and end the reading of the day's passage with the prayer of the early Christians - "Come, Lord Jesus, come!"





"Enlarge the space of your tent" (Is. 54:2) is the title of the 44-page Working Document for the Continental Stage of the current synodal process at the universal level.
