### WELCOME!

The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a Minor Basilica by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's Coat of Arms presents a shield sheltered by the ombrellino, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin - *every eye shall see him*.

Today at our Masses we recall the tragic events of September 11, 2001. We remember those who lost their lives, their families and friends. Let us also pray for peace in our troubled world – a peace that begins in our own hearts and homes.

### FUNERAL CELEBRATIONS

Just a thought or two about funerals ... Christians, since the earliest days of the Church, took special care of the bodies of the deceased because they had been temples of the Holy Spirit in life. This tradition of prayer and burial has been handed down over 2,000 years. From the catacombs of Rome to our own cemeteries we continue to honour the resting place of the dead. In the Order of Christian Funerals, we find three distinct moments of prayer the deceased and those who have gathered to mourn with the family. In each of these moments we celebrate God's life in the life of the deceased. The first moment is the Vigil for the Deceased - prayers, Scripture readings and reflections are shared usually the day before the funeral. A Funeral Mass is the second moment in which we hear the Word of God and celebrate the Eucharist in thanksgiving for God's wondrous gifts in the life of the deceased. The funeral rites in the Catholic Church conclude with the Rite of *Committal* during which the deceased is laid to rest, or their cremated remains are interred. In each of these moments we pray with the grieving – these Rites are for the living – and we pray for the repose of the soul of our loved one. We shouldn't shy away from using terms like "funeral" or "death" ... they are realities in each of our lives. Sometimes there is a tendency to gloss over this reality with expressions like "a celebration of life." Our funerals remind us of the mystery of God's plan in life and death. While we gather in sorrow, we do not despair, because we follow Jesus the Crucified and Risen Lord. We have an excellent booklet and other resources to help plan for the funeral celebrations at the Cathedral ... often these plans can be left at the funeral home with which you have made pre-arrangements.
