WELCOME!

The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a *Minor Basilica* by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's *Coat of Arms* presents a shield sheltered by the *ombrellino*, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin - *every eye shall see him*.

FOR THE COMMON GOOD

This is the consistent message of the Catholic Church our Holy Father, the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, and our own Bishop. There can be no religious exemption for Catholics because the Magisterium of the Church has clearly supported receiving the vaccine. Some may object on the grounds of conscience, which is their right, but it must be a well-formed conscience. Sadly, there is much misunderstanding, misinformation and conspiracy theories on the internet. This has caused some to be fearful of the vaccine or to believe that it has some nefarious purpose. Vaccines have helped to eradicate once common diseases - polio, small pox, etc - let's hope and pray that wide use of the vaccine will help to eradicate this pernicious virus.

SYNOD OF BISHOPS

Preparations have begun around the world for the 2023 Synod of Bishops. The theme for this Synod is the concept of synodality as a way of being Church - communion, participation and mission. Over the next few months there will be a process of local consultation guided by the Preparatory Document of the Synod. Watch for an invitation to participate in this process. The opening of the Synod of Bishops will be celebrated in Dioceses around the world on Sunday, October 17, 2021. Bishop Crosby will preside at the 4:00 p.m. Mass that day to mark the beginning of the synodal process in our Consultations at Diocesan and Diocese. National levels will conclude in 2022 and the meeting of representatives of Bishops' Conferences and others will take place in Rome in October 2023.

Monday, September 20th is Canada's Federal Election Day. All are encouraged to exercise their democratic right to vote.

CATHOLIC FUNERALS

The Catholic funeral rites are offered for the consolation of the living and for the repose of the deceased. There are three parts of a Catholic funeral: *Vigil Prayers, Funeral Liturgy, and Burial.*

The *Funeral Liturgy* can be the celebration of Mass in the Parish Church, or a Liturgy of the Word. The Prayers of Commendation conclude the Funeral Liturgy. The Funeral Mass is usually celebrated in the presence of the deceased, or with the cremated remains.
