JANUARY 19, 2020 - 2ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The Christmas season has come to a close and we're back in Ordinary Time! Of the Liturgical seasons, this may feel like a 'blah' time of year with nothing special happening. Some might say it feels just like when we return to work after the holidays, with a bit of a heavy sigh and a 'back to the grind' kind of attitude. Yet there is something very beautiful and special about the ordinary that makes us into Saints. In fact, the ordinary is really what life is all about.

The special seasons and holidays are actually meant to pepper the everyday with a little extra spice in order to reorient ourselves and remind us about what's important in the everyday. The everyday is the real stuff of life. How we live day by day; through the grind and through the common is what defines who we are. Sometimes we wish for the spectacular. We contemplate, "if only Jesus appeared to me like He has done to some of the Saints" or "it would be easier to not have to worry about being holy and one day be given the opportunity for martyrdom and have it all quickly". The Saints became Saints because they lived with love in the everyday. They knew how to be ordinary. The only reason they were able to respond appropriately when Jesus appeared to them or when they were called to martyrdom was because they had already led a life committed to God. Those 'special moments' only enhanced and solidified what was already present.

Do you think that when Mary was approached by the Archangel Gabriel, she had been living a listless life bemoaning the everyday drudgery? Did she give her "yes" to God without having been prepared ahead of time to take on the massive responsibility of bearing and raising the Son of God? Of course not! She spent every day of her quiet, ordinary life committed to God; loving Him and loving her neighbour. *That* is why she could say yes at that pivotal moment!

So we go now with renewed energy back to our daily lives. We thank God for what He has given us; the gift of being able to give our lives daily to Him, to grow through the ordinary and to live our ordinary lives *extraordinarily*.Fr. Steve




