Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Welcome once again to Fr. Michael O'Brien who is helping us with the celebrations of Masses this weekend. This is also Father Eduardo's first time to celebrate Mass at Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament church. Here are some reflections on today's Scripture: The story Jesus tells in today's Gospel is not about need, but about greed. Greed is like a fire - the more wood you pile on it, the hungrier it gets. One of the chief problems in our times is that many people don't realize how well-off they really are. Have we fallen into greed which is idolatry and made possessions a god and become enslaved by material things?

Speaking to hundreds of thousands of young people at World Youth Day this week in Poland, Pope Francis challenged them. A big soccer fan himself, when Pope Francis mentioned the sport, young people cheered. When he referred to the World Cup, it brought even louder cheers. Then he paused, looked at the sea of youth and said, "Jesus is a greater prize than the World Cup!" Young people stood, raised their hands and gave a sustained cheer.

Here is a thought from Pope St. John Paul II which is truly challenging and makes us think: "Pervading materialism imposes its dominion on man today in many different forms and with aggressiveness that spares no one. The most sacred principles, which were the sure guides for the behaviour of individuals, and society, are being hollowed out be false pretences concerning freedom, the sacredness of life, the indissolubility of marriage, the true

sense of human sexuality, the right attitude towards the material good that progress has to offer.

"Many people now are tempted to selfindulgence and consumerism, and human identity is often defined by what one owns. Prosperity and affluence, even when they are only beginning to be available to larger strata of society, tend to make people assume that they have a right to all that prosperity can bring, and thus they can become more selfish in their demands.

"Everybody wants a full freedom in all the areas of human behaviour and new models of morality are being proposed in the name of would-be freedom. When the moral fibre of a nation is weakened, when the sense of personal responsibility is diminished, then the door is open for the justification of injustice, for violence in all its forms, and for the manipulation of the many by the few. The challenge that is already with us is the temptation to accept as true freedom what in reality is only a new form of slavery."

As we continue into August holidays, we pray daily for our young people, for the safety of all who travel on holiday, for workers in our fields and greenhouses, for our sick and for people who can't get out. In your Family Prayer, please pray for all vocations: marriage, single life, religious life of Sisters and Brothers, and the ordained priesthood and diaconate.




St. Michael's Parish is considering organizing a pilgrimage for September 2017 to Fatima, Lourdes & the Shrines of Spain.




