First Sunday of Lent March 5, 2017

From the Desk of Father John:

On this first Sunday of Lent, I would like to share with you my thoughts from my homily of Ash Wednesday.

The Lord's journey to Jerusalem with his disciples 2000 years ago gave the Lord an opportunity to teach His disciples. The events and encounters along the way allowed Jesus to prepare the disciples for the events that were to take place in Jerusalem; His arrest, trial, crucifixion and resurrection. On this Ash Wednesday we begin this journey in a special way. We are not headed to the Jerusalem of the disciples, but rather we are headed to the New Jerusalem, the Jerusalem of eternity - our heavenly home!

So where will we journey with the Lord? We will journey with Christ to the desert; we will journey with Christ up the mountain; we will go to the well and encounter the Samaritan woman; we will journey with Christ and encounter the man born blind, we will journey with Christ to Bethany and see Christ bring Lazarus back to life; and we will journey with Christ to Jerusalem to His death.

So where does our journey take us today? Today we are being asked if we want to be part of this journey. In a little while we will be marked by the sign of the Cross, a sign that we are prepared to take seriously this journey with the Lord! The Gospel presents to us the implications of being marked by ashes.

It is about preparing our hearts to be formed or rather transformed by our encounter with Christ during this journey. Prayer, fasting and almsgiving are the traditional ways to prepare our hearts for the journey to Jerusalem. Whatever special Lenten practices we embrace this year, they are to open us to encounter Christ in a radically new way. How will we encounter Christ in the desert? Christ on the mountain? Christ at the well? Christ with the blind man? Christ with Lazarus?

Our Lenten journey and practices must open us up to a profound encounter with Jesus Christ!

Let us pray for one another!Fr. John


