#### **Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Following the days of Fr. Patrick's Vocation Summit last week, we hear this weekend about a great vocation story from the Gospel of Mark.

'Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!.....Immediately the man regained his sight and followed Jesus on the way.' (Mark 10). This blind man whose name is Bartimaeus (which means Son of Honour) leaves his only possession behind, his cloak, and follows Jesus, 'the Way, the Truth, and the Life' (John). Are we satisfied with the ways things are with us or do we beg for greater spiritual insight, greater depth perception, in order to become 'children of honour?' Even in his darkness, Bartimaeus knew what he was looking for. He stands out among the crowds who are curious and the apostles who don't yet understand that Jesus must enter his Passion in Jerusalem. or the scribes and religious leaders who are critical, disturbed and threatened. How much of us is Bartimaeus with ears and eves of faith that open us to the journey Jesus is leading us through. Are we sadly self-satisfied?

Everyday I watch the progress of our new building and pray that we can all see beyond the structure to perceive the presence of Jesus who is gathering us together in a community where perception of reality, that our faith alone can open for us, grows day by day. All the faith celebrations of our families down through the generations of our forefathers and mothers is in the atmosphere of our rebuilding of a place of worship at St. Michael's.

We will also enjoy the added facility of a daily chapel, where Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament can be offered; a chapel we will name St. Peter's Chapel.


