#### Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Apostle James issues a challenge to us as we hear in the second reading at Mass this weekend. Faith without love is dead – it is not really faith at all. We are alive in our faith by imitating Jesus and expressing our love by our care for the poor, feeding the hungry and sheltering the homeless.

This week many were asking how we can help in the resettlement of the many refugees we hear in the news who are having a tough time finding safety in Europe. Sister Elaine is working with the local ecumenical refugee committee which has its hands full right now in welcoming refugees from various nations. She passes on this advice: if we sponsor refugees as a parish we will need lots of help: people to look after the paper work, fundraising, finding a place to live, taking them to the doctor, dentist, grocery and clothing stores, showing them how the bus system works, bringing them to ESL (English as a second language) classes, etc. I'm also conferring with our diocesan refugee office which is in Windsor to see what we would need to do. If you are interested in helping form a parish refugee committee, please call and leave your name and phone number. Individuals and families are also able to sponsor refugees.

OUR BUILDING PROJECT is moving forward quite well. The architect and diocesan engineer met with Amico for a site meeting this week. The footings are poured and the walls are about to go up. The steel is being fashioned. Only one snag so far: underneath the mechanical room, which is lower than the rest of the basement level, is a river running underneath. This is able to be treated without incurring added costs. Please be generous and help out financially – by pledging or re-pledging – we want to avoid borrowing with interest payments afterwards, if at all possible. The new St. Michael's belongs to all of us, rich and poor, old and young, so please do your part, according to your ability.

THE FEAST OF ST. MICHAEL, our patron, will be celebrated on SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 27<sup>TH</sup>. Mass will be celebrated as a multi-lingual Liturgy at 10:30 a.m. There will be no Italian or Portuguese Masses that day – the 9:00 a.m. and Noon Masses will be cancelled that day, so that everyone can be together for our patron's feast.

<u>Youth Ministry</u> ~ the SMYL program begins in October and the high school program begins in September.




