## Reflection on the Reading from Act of the Apostles 10:34-43:

In the Gospel reading for the Easter Vigil, Matthew recounts an Angel's announcement to two women that Jesus has been raised. In turn the women, with a mixture of fear and joy, hurry to announce the Good News to other disciples. Mark, Luke and John also indicate that the first proclamation of Jesus' Resurrection was met with various responses, including fear, doubt, and disbelief. But soon the transforming power of Christ's resurrection is released in his followers by the power of the Holy Spirit.

The First Reading for Easter Sunday indicates the complete transformation of Peter. The same man, who a short time ago denied even knowing Jesus, quickly comes to such depth of faith and conviction that despite opposition and persecution, he repeatedly proclaims Jesus as the Messiah. In preceding chapters, the author, Luke, describes Peter as a fervent Apostle, proclaiming Jesus' Resurrection to fellow Jews first in Jerusalem, then throughout Judea and further Jewish territory.

At the time of today's reading, Peter has begun to open himself to Paul's missionary activity among the Gentiles. By the end of Acts, through the efforts of Peter, Paul and many coworkers the Good News of Jesus Christ will spread through the Gentile world. Thus unfolds the story of the early Church, in stages outlined by Luke at the beginning of his narrative. Through the resurrected Christ, divine Spirit comes upon the disciples; in this spirit of power, they will serve as witnesses to Christ, "in Jerusalem, in Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of earth" (Acts 1:8).


