

For the Third Sunday of Easter:

The Gospel Reading today is taken from the final Resurrection appearance in the Gospel according to Luke. The Resurrection stories heard last week in John's account and this week in Luke's story share some elements. First, in both, the resurrected Christ greets His disciples with the phrase "Peace be with you." It is a greeting of comfort and support to the group so traumatized by the events of the past few days. Second, both Luke and John place much emphasis on the physical presence of the resurrected Christ. Jesus encourages the disciples to touch him, "for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." Jesus even asks for food to eat, indicating the complete restoration of his corporeal existence. Third, both Resurrection narratives discuss the element of "doubt" among the disciples. Recall doubting Thomas in John. In Luke, Jesus asks all His disciples, "Why do doubts arise in your hearts?'

In today's Gospel Reading, we hear the final words spoken by Jesus in Luke's account, and they convey two important elements in the *kerygma* (proclamation) of the early Church. First, the life, Death, and Resurrection of Christ fulfill Sacred Scripture ("the Law of Moses, the Prophets, and the



Psalms'). In other words, God is faithful to His covenantal promises. Second, the disciples receive their final instructions: they are to preach "repentance and forgiveness... to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem." With these words, the Church receives its divine direction to evangelize the world.
