For the Fourth Sunday of Easter:

The first reading, taken from the Book of Acts of the Apostles starts with the arrest of Peter and John by the captain of the temple. They are on trial before the Sanhedrin. Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit presents the Church's beliefs and assertions about Jesus in light of His Death and Resurrection. 1. In his speech Peter makes two declarations about "Jesus Christ of Nazareth." First, it was God Himself who "raised [Jesus] from the dead," thus confirming Jesus' innocence before the very group that condemned Him. Second, "there is salvation in no one else"; therefore, Jesus is the universal Saviour.

Peter also cites prophetic texts that are fulfilled in the Death and Resurrection of Christ, such as Isaiah 28:16 and Psalm 118:22: "Jesus is 'the stone that was rejected by you, the builders; it has become the cornerstone.' "The conviction that the resurrected Christ was the foretold "cornerstone" from Israel's prophetic tradition proved to be a very effective way of explaining the resurrected Christ as the foundation of the Church.

In the Gospel today, Jesus refers to Himself as the "good shepherd." As a shepherd to His flock, Jesus is no mere "hired hand." Jesus' relationship with sheep is as intimate as His relationship with the Father, assured with the commitment: "I lay down my life for the sheep." In addition, "other sheep" from another "fold" belong to the flock that Jesus leads. This is likely a reference to His Gentile followers. For both Jewish and the Gentile followers, there is "one shepherd," Jesus.

Jesus presents Himself and His Father in complete control of His destiny: "I have power to lay [my life] down and to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father." In this way, the shepherd leads His entire flock to Resurrection and new life.
