FOR SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER:

First Reading: It is Easter time, and if we need evidence of the difference Resurrection makes, we have it in our first reading. Recall how recently Peter suffered from the habit of putting his foot in his mouth; worse, recall his inflated promises to Jesus that crumbled the minute Peter sensed danger for himself. Now, he is an esteemed leader, renowned among believers and unbelievers for the power of God that flows through him. His shadow is enough to heal and his words win large numbers to the Lord. So much has changed in so little time.

On Divine Mercy Sunday these events retold in Acts demonstrate powerfully the extraordinary mercy of God. Peter's betrayal is a thing of the past and these simple fishermen have become powerful evangelists winning hearts to Christ, transforming lives, and eventually the world.

Second reading: and the next 5 weeks of readings, are apocalyptic literature. This kind of writing always involves a revelation or unveiling of some hidden truth about the future. To unveil, however, this writing ironically employs highly symbolic language – difficult to decipher. It was written to offer comfort and hope to people suffering persecution, assuring readers that God will ultimately triumph over evil and will establish his Kingdom on earth.

On the "Lord's day" John receives a vision in which he hears trumpets, symbols of divine presence. A voice orders him to

record the very things now being narrated. When he looks, first he sees "seven gold lampstands" symbolizing the seven major Churches of his era, each in a different city, that represents the entire Church of that time. In their midst is the mysterious "Son of Man," a title borrowed from the Book of Daniel that Jesus frequently appropriated to himself. Here, the term suggests a divine person who wields power and authority. This is a highly symbolic depiction of Christ in his heavenly glory, wearing a priestly "robe" and a kingly sash.

It was believed that the presence of divinity brought certain death, so John falls at the feet of the Son of Man, who reassures him and identifies himself as "the first and the last," who holds "the keys of Death and Hades" — another image of divine presence and power. The reading ends with the mysterious Christ figure urging John to write everything that will be revealed to him.
