So also they make acts of faith in their friends and in those they love. For in order to say "I love you" and really mean it, one must believe in the beloved. Love and belief are two sides of the same coin. I can say "I love you" because I believe in you, and I can say "I believe you"

Diocesan News: Welcome to the 215 Catechumens and Candidates who were welcomed into the Roman Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil on Saturday evening in Parishes throughout the Diocese.

Our Diocesan Refugee and Immigration Office recently welcomed an 81 and 83 year old couple from Damascus who were finally reunited with their children and grandchildren after waiting for several years. We expect 20 or more to come to Canada in the coming months through the program of the Diocese of Hamilton, thanks to the interest and support of several of our Parishes.

Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King - On February 25, just three days before the end of the pontificate of Pope Benedict XVI, and with his blessing, the Cathedral of Christ the King in Hamilton was formally given the status of Minor Basilica. Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself.

Second Sunday of Easter was officially designated as Divine Mercy Sunday by Pope John Paul II in 2000 when he canonized Faustyna Kowalska. It was in her visions that Jesus presented her with the above prayer, commanded her to have His image painted and the devotion spread.
