Reflection on the Second Reading (Philippians 3:8-14)

The event on the Damascus road (Acts 9) transformed Paul. Elsewhere he stresses the power of God's grace; here he gives his personal assessment: "I consider everything as a loss because of the supreme good of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord." He is referring to the intimacy of biblical knowledge by which one enters into communion with Christ, by knowing "him and the power of his Resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by being conformed to his death." Paul desires to be fully identified with Christ, conscious that he will not achieve this by his own efforts but by God's grace and 'righteousness" or "justice." This justice is illustrated in today's Gospel, which tells of grace extended to the adulterous woman, who is a figure of God's people. The new justice to which Paul refers is exercised through the restored relationship that springs from merciful love. Adhering to Christ means giving up self-sufficiency "that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having any righteousness of my own based on the law by that which comes through faith in Christ." Our knowledge of and sharing with Christ is always imperfect; Christian existence is characterized not by having reached a goal but by "straining forward to what lies ahead" in pursuit of knowing Christ. Paul reminds us that we depend on God to restore us: he knows that righteousness cannot be claimed on one's personal merit; it is an ongoing gift from God.
