

Reflection on the Gospel 20:19-31):

The reading from John's Gospel has two appearances of the risen Jesus. In both scenes, Jesus appears on the first day of the week when his disciples are gathered behind locked doors. In both scenes Jesus greets his followers with "Peace be with you." Although this is a typical form of greeting of a rabbi to his followers, in this context Jesus is assuring his fearful disciples, that he has been victorious over death, and that he has fulfilled the promises he gave to them at their last meal together. He had said then that peace was his farewell gift to them, and that he would come back to them. At the supper, he had also promised that the Spirit of truth, the Advocate, would come to them. Now, breathing on them, he imparts the promised Spirit, and empowers them to forgive sins. He bestows these gifts of peace and Holy Spirit on the disciples who had abandoned him during the Passion, thereby revealing his forgiveness and reconciliation with them. Just as Jesus himself had been sent by the Father so now he sends his disciples. No longer behind locked doors, they are to continue Jesus's mission of forgiveness. 
