# 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Easter:

**First Reading:** The Acts of the Apostles continues to tell the story of the spread of the Gospel in the days following the Resurrection and Ascension of Jesus. To keep them from preaching about Jesus, the authorities had the Apostles jailed. An angel of God secretly released them during the night and ordered them to resume their preaching in the Temple area. Imagine the shock of the Sanhedrin when the very men they believed to be languishing in a cell are instead found doing the very thing that got them imprisoned in the first place.

The authorities puzzle over how these men escaped locked cells, but the Apostles are convinced God is directing their fate. That is why, after this second arrest, they dare to defy the Sanhedrin and insist they must "obey God rather than human beings." The authorities want to silence them to put an end to this fascination with Jesus, but also because the Apostles have coloured the high priest's hands red with the blood of Jesus. Their brazen audacity so infuriates the leaders that they determine to kill the Apostles, but a wise council member advises them to take a "wait and see" posture instead.

The authorities settle for flogging the disciples before freeing them. Beaten and warned to keep silent about Jesus, the Apostles go forth rejoicing, not because they are free, nor because they narrowly escaped death, but because they were "considered worthy" to suffer for the sake of Christ. That same sense of privilege should imbue your proclamation today.

**Second Reading:** This reading brings us into the heavenly throne room where a vast throng worships God and the "Lamb." Our Liturgy is but a rehearsal for the eternal liturgy we will celebrate when we reach the shores of the divine kingdom. John describes a cosmic ritual in which every form of life becomes a single chorus of praise to the God who created it all and to the Lamb (Christ) who won salvation for all.

Written intentionally in a cryptic style that is intelligible to its intended audience, while remaining obscure to those who threaten the community of believers, apocalyptic writing offers hope and consolation to people suffering persecution. This wondrous vision counters the brutal realities and the dire risks Christians faced in the practice of their faith. John's message is clear: Christ is not a victim; he is a victor reigning at the right hand of God. He is the source of life and those who give themselves to him, no matter what present trials they must endure, will conquer death with him and find eternal reward in his Kingdom.
