First Reading, Isaiah 22:15, 19-23

This reading begins with a brief condemnation of Shebna, a steward in charge of the royal palace of King Hezekiah, and is then followed by the transfer of power to Eliakim, son of the high priest Hilkiah. The reading focuses on Eliakim's authority and the role that he will assume, all in God's own words. He will be clothed with a robe and sash, symbols of his divinely given authority, explained further by three images. First, calling him 'father' indicates a relationship with the people that goes far beyond that of palace steward; as a father to the inhabitants of Jerusalem and Judah, he will participate in the governing power of the Davidic dynasty for the whole southern kingdom. Second, as keeper of the key of the House of David, Eliakim will have the power to allow or prohibit entrance into the palace; he thus has authority to decide who will have access to the king. (This foreshadows the Gospel of Matthew-Peter receiving the 'keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.') The third image is that of a peg that securely fastens the tent. This image presents Eliakim as the one who will see to the safekeeping of those in his care.

Eliakim is being given the opportunity to act as a wise father, a careful guardian, and a symbol of stability.
