

#### For the First Sunday in Advent

No wonder the culture ignores Advent—It doesn't speak in the soft and gentle tones we would like. Instead, Advent speaks boldly and, one might say, with a forked tongue, for it proclaims prophecies of salvation and peace while simultaneously

reminding us of the lateness of the hour and the requirement to remain ever vigilant. The more attractive message of a Baby in a manger is the one that gets attention and inspires greeting cards.

Isaiah begins with a rousing message meant to encourage a people facing possible military destruction. But he also speaks to individual hearts that have lost hope and are limp with failing energy. He paints a picture of the future that requires a present response: God's word will surge forth from Jerusalem and transform all it touches, but it will also call each heart to respond by yielding to the call to "walk in the light of the Lord!"

Why do we still heed Paul's warning that we "know what time it is" when Jesus insisted that such knowledge was reserved to the Father? Indeed, without predicting a particular day, Paul did, like his Christian contemporaries, anticipate Christ's return within his own lifetime. That these words remained an important part of early Christian teaching even after it became apparent Christ's return would be delayed indicates the community found meaning beyond the literal in Paul's admonition. For every generation, Paul describes time not found on a clock or calendar but inscribed on the heart of sensible believers who understand that morning follows night, and then night comes again. The words don't speak of one particular moment but of every day, for each day draws us closer to

the end—whether that be the day of Christ's return, or the day of our individual entry into eternity.

Like a mother rousing a drowsy teenager, Paul urges us to wake up and to remain awake while daylight lingers. Living a wakeful life is no easy task, for many objects, good and bad, compete for our attention. But time moves inexorably and that awareness, once grasped, should stir us to action. "Put on the Lord Jesus Christ." says Paul, like a warm garment that shields us from the dangers of the flesh.

Jesus's words, spoken near the end of his ministry, and taken from the great apocalyptic discourse are meant to stir and unsettle. Gospel paints a vivid picture of the end times and call for constant watchfulness, for the Son of Man will return at a time we least expect. As in the days of Noah, most will go about their business as usual, the danger and destruction coming suddenly and unexpectedly upon them. While Jesus claims no knowledge of when the end will come, His urgency is clear. Whether it is close, or far off, the day of judgment will rush upon us like the flood that swept away Noah's generation. Jesus wants us better prepared than Noah's neighbours who "knew nothing" until it was too late. "Therefore you MUST be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour."


