#### Reflection on the Second Reading from Romans 13:11-14

In the reading from Romans, Paul uses familiar human experiences and images to delve into the unseen mysteries of faith. Everyone knows the moments of awaking from sleep and of the darkness of night giving way to the brightness of day. Writing to a community in Rome, Paul urges them to wake from slumber and to live in the light of the day, casting off the deeds of darkness.

The imagery has a certain paradox about it, because the death and Resurrection of Jesus has already inaugurated the new age, the dawning of the day of salvation. Believers are therefore already living in the light of day. However, like the early believers in Rome, we are still awaiting Christ's coming again in glory, his *parousia*. A common way of referring to this paradoxical tension is the *already-and-not-yet of salvation*.

In much of this letter, Paul develops significant theological insights, the core of Christian faith much discussed and debated throughout history. In this part of the letter Paul urges the Christians in Rome to live in light of what they believe. Continuing the image of darkness and light, he says believers should take off the clothing of darkness and put on the armour of light. Then, properly clothed for the daylight, they are to conduct themselves properly, with dignity and decorum.

The deeds of darkness that Paul lists are similar to others in Paul's letters. Broadly, the vices can be grouped into acts of drunkenness, sexual impropriety, and community discord. All of these are works of the flesh, whereas Christians are to live according to the spirit. Paul returns to the image of clothing, with the most important and encompassing garment being the Lord Jesus Christ himself.

Advent is a time of waiting, conversion and of hope: waiting-memory of the first, humble coming of the Lord in our mortal flesh; waiting-supplication for his final, glorious coming as Lord of history and universal judge;

<u>conversion</u>, to which the liturgy at this time often refers, quoting the prophets . . . <u>joyful hope</u> that the salvation already accomplished by Christ . . . and the reality of grace in the world, will mature and reach their fullness, thereby granting us what is promised by faith.

To begin to appreciate the "true meaning of Advent," we can look to a few of the saints of Advent: the models of Christian perfection to whom the Church points for our edification during these three to four weeks.

St. Francis Xavier, (Dec. 3), was one of the original members of the Society of Jesus. He is best known for his mission trips to the Far East, opening India and Japan to the spread of the gospel.



Francis hoped to do the same in China but died on the journey. He was named a patron saint of the missions because of his success at evangelism.

Not as well-known was Francis's reputation as a wonder-worker. He cured the sick, restored hearing and speech to the deaf and mute, multiplied coins that he gave to the poor, and raised the dead. In other words, he performed the same kind of deeds that heralded the coming of the Messiah into the world (Matt. 11:4–5). Christ promised that his followers would perform mighty deeds in his name as signs that they were sent by him (Mark 16:15–18).



Not much is known for certain about St. Nicholas of Myra, the bishop whose feast is on Dec. 6<sup>th</sup>, but the legends surrounding him are rich and varied. He was also believed to be a wonder-worker, but he is better known for his love for children and generosity to the poor. Although historians doubt he was present at the Council of Nicaea, he's lauded as a fierce defender of orthodoxy. (*From Catholic*


Canadian Food for Children in Toronto has received sufficient support (financial and prayers, we are sure!) that normal operations are able
