Pastoral Care to those in Hospital: Privacy-of-Information laws prohibit the parish from obtaining information about parishioners in the hospital. A family member is asked to contact the parish whenever a parishioner is in hospital and requests a pastoral visit.

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Excerpt from "Remembering Heaven – Jewels of the Paschal Mystery" – To begin our Advent Season

The season of Advent is loaded with the precious gems of hope, joy, waiting and expectation. Its theological perspective is threefold: the coming of Christ, born in history (past); the coming of Christ in our lives (present); and the coming of Christ at the end of time (future).

This time of the year is set aside by the church as a special period of preparation, of expectant waiting.

In Advent readings, we hear the promises made by our God to our ancestors in faith, to us. We journey with important figures such as John the Baptist, Mary and Elizabeth, whose reassuring presence guides our hope. Parents presenting children for Baptism, Confirmation or First Eucharist, as well as candidates, catechumens and sponsors, will relate easily to the anxieties of Mary and Joseph, who were surrounded by mystery and so many unanswered questions. They stood on faith, and so do we. At the same time, John the Baptist challenges us to "prepare the way," placing an awesome responsibility on anyone involved in paving the way for the sacraments of initiation.

Though the calendar year is coming to an end, the liturgical year is just beginning. We continue our journey more deeply into the Paschal Mystery starting with the Incarnation and culminating in the Triduum. The wood of the manger points us toward the wood of the cross; the angels singing to shepherds are also keeping watch at the empty tomb. The four weeks of Advent usher us into the Mystery while encompassing it at the same time. These weeks need to be carefully set out as they have a language all their own: Music, colour, scripture, prayers, customs, and a healthy dose of silence.
