For Fourth Sunday of Advent:

The Ark of the Covenant (or the Ark of God) dating back to 1200 BC contained Aaron's rod, a jar of manna and the store tablets upon which the Ten Commandments were inscribed. Most importantly, the Ark represented God's presence with the people of Israel. David's concern for proper placement and housing of the ark is understandable. God reveals through prophet Nathan a new covenant that God will establish with Israel and Israel's king, David. Prior covenants were between God and an individual, or God and a family, or God and a nation. God's covenantal promise to Israel is to "appoint a place" (that is, give Israel land upon which to settle and call their own), where they will "be disturbed no more" by "enemies." To David, God's covenantal promise was two fold. "Your house and your kingdom shall be made sure forever before me" and "your throne, David, shall be established forever." God promises descendants in David's own family line, but also promises to continue a close father-son relationship with them. Christians throughout the ages believe that the birth of Jesus fulfilled the "Davidic covenant", the promise God made to King David.

In the Gospel, Luke tells us that Joseph is "of the house of David". We also hear from Gabriel's words to Mary that through the conception and birth of Jesus, God will fulfill his covenantal promise to David. Jesus will be "called the Son of the Most High."

As the season of Advent draws to a close, we wait in eager expectation for the celebration of the birth of Christ and remain ever-vigilant for His return.

Fr. Robert Barron on Advent preparation:

"One of the best ways to enter into Advent is to get reacquainted with the Bible. Many Catholics don't know the Bible very well. Vatican II called for a revival in biblical studies, but I don't think that's happened yet, at least among average Catholics.

We need to understand the great biblical story, beginning with Creation and the Fall, the formation of Israel, the coming of the prophets and patriarchs, and finally the formation of a people that leads to the coming of a savior. It's only when we get the sweep of that whole story that we understand why the coming of the savior matters, and what the coming of the savior even means.

When you extract Jesus from the biblical narrative, he becomes a mere guru, teacher, or philosopher. That's all our culture gives us: Jesus as another mystic, seer, or sage. But when you see Jesus against the backdrop of the great story of Israel, now you see that he's the savior.

So this Advent, I would recommend to all Catholics, open up your Bible and get deeply immersed in the great biblical story".
