Reflection on the Gospel of Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23:

Before the birth of Jesus, an Angel appeared to Joseph in a dream. In today's Gospel, Joseph receives two more revelatory dreams. The pattern of the two dreams today continues the established pattern: the Angel directs Joseph how to act, and Joseph responds obediently. Throughout Matthew's opening chapters, Joseph is a righteous man who readily accepts the revelations that God gives him. In all three dream scenes, allusions to the Hebrew Scriptures create continuity with the past even as God is doing something new in the present.

The first scene begins when the wise men departed. Though the wise men had thwarted Herod's plans, the Angel reveals that Herod is still seeking to destroy the child. Like his ancestor Joseph, the new Joseph is to flee to Egypt for refuge. Unlike the Joseph of old who interpreted Pharaoh's dreams, Joseph's dreams need no interpretation. The Lord's directions are clear, and Joseph follows them exactly. The final verse is from the Prophet Hosea, fulfilled in a new way. In Hosea, Israel is God's son, called from Egypt to return home; now, Jesus, God's own son, is called from Egypt to return to his homeland, where he will minister to his people.

One more dream directs the family, not to Judea where Herod's son is wreaking havoc on the people, but to Nazareth in Galilee. (Based on Workbook for Lectors, Gospel Readers and Proclaimers of the Word)

Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God - This feast is a celebration of Mary's motherhood of Jesus. The English title "Mother of God" is a translation of the Latin title Dei Genetrix, which means "She Who Generated God", as the corresponding Greek title Θεοτόκος (Theotokos) means "She Who Gave Birth to God". This title was dogmatically adopted at the First Council of Ephesus (431 AD) as a way to assert that Jesus is God, and that His Mother can therefore be called Mother of God. The title that the January 1st feast celebrates is thus not only Mariological, but also Christological.

Sts. Basil and Gregory were childhood friends who both came from saintly families. Their parents and some of their siblings were also saints. They grew up in Cappadocia (current day Turkey).

Basil became a lawyer with great rhetorical skills, but since he was tempted by pride he decided to sell all he owned and became a priest and a monk. He founded a monastery and wrote down instructions on community life, which have become famous especially in the east.

From his youth, Basil was friends with Gregory of Nazianzus, another brilliant thinker and orator. Gregory followed a similar career path as Basil—he was ordained a priest, even though he yearned for the life of a monk.

Basil and Gregory were defining figures as the early Church sought to figure out just how to describe Jesus as fully human and fully divine. They helped the Church articulate this mystery and refute persistent strains of thought that would emphasize one aspect of Jesus' nature over another. Both were largely responsible for safeguarding the faith that has guided the Church for thousands of years. Their doctrinal contributions are codified in the Nicene Creed. central story woven throughout Scripture and presents it in an easy-to-read, concise manner.


