Reflection on the First Reading from Isaiah 11:1-10

Today's prophecy from Isaiah dates from the second half of the 8th century BC, a period when Judah repeatedly turned to various foreign nations for protection from war and invasion. The people seem to take for granted God's promise that a descendant of King David will rule forever and they no longer fulfill their responsibilities in the covenant made on Mount Sinai. Their rituals are perfunctory and there is widespread social injustice in the land. Although Isaiah confronts Judah with this reality, he also expresses hope in the coming of the righteous son of David , a king who will fulfill his proper role in leading the people back to faithfulness to God. He envisions the coming of a righteous king descended from Jesse's son David as God's instrument to establish a future kingdom of peace, justice, and right relationships in all creation.

Such a king would, act in the "spirit of the Lord"; he would possess the gift of wisdom to judge rightly, a wisdom learned by proper reverence for God. The attributes of this hoped-for king later developed into Christian traditional names for gifts of the Holy Spirit. The Prophet continues his portayal of a kingdom ruled by such a ruler: the power of evit would be broken, and all things would live in peace and harmony. Former conflict and opposition would be reversed, and all relationships set aright. Centuries after Isaiah, Christians understood his vision of God's ultimate reign over all things through a chosen ruler to be fulfilled in Jesus the Messiah, who proclaimed and inaugurated the Kingdom of God.




