Reflection on the Gospel: (Matthew 5:38-48)

Today's Gospel reading continues the Sermon on the Mount, specifically including the last two of six antithetical statements begun last Sunday. Matthew presents Jesus as the true interpreter of the Law Moses received on Sinai by contrasting one of its teachings with his own instructions. It is important to recall that in beginning his instruction to the disciples, Jesus reassures them that he does not intend to abolish, but to fulfill Jewish Law and Scriptures.

Both pairings of old and new teachings call Jesus' followers to place no limits on love of the other, regardless of anyone's behaviour or seeming worthiness. He first quotes Exodus 21:24, a command of the Law originally meant to curb unlimited retaliation, which was common at the time of Moses. For those who live according to the teaching of Jesus and share in the Kingdom of Heaven, there must be no retaliation at all for injury or offence. Instead, one must replace offence with kindness. Jesus' instruction seems to apply even to the hated Romans, who claimed the right to seize the goods of native peoples or compel them into the service of the empire.

This point leads to one of the most difficult of Jesus' commands: to love not only neighbours, as the Law requires (Leviticus 19:18), but to love and do good even to enemies.

For Jesus' disciples the standard of righteousness is much greater; it is no less than imitation of God. The word teleios. translated "perfect," does not demand moral faultlessness, impossible for humans. The term most likely alludes to Deuteronomy 18:13, in which Moses calls the people to be completely devoted to (teleios) following divine instruction. Jesus will use the same word later in response to one who inquires what he must do to have eternal life (Math 19:16).
