Reflection on the Second Reading: (1Corinthians 2:1-5)

Paul's correspondence with the Church at Corinth addresses a community that was exposed to numerous influences circulating in this large, cosmopolitan port city. Though the Apostle to the Gentiles spent about two and a half years preaching and teaching Christ to this urban Church, entrenched habits of thought and action remained or returned all too soon. The imperial culture in general valued power, wealth, and status, while various Greek philosophies exalted knowledge acquired by use of human reason. Among such realities, Paul preached the wisdom of a Redeemer who died on a cross – the shameful instrument of public execution imposed upon revolutionaries and slaves.

Paul's message offers not human, but divine wisdom: the "mystery" of God. With this term (Greek *mysterion*), the Apostle signifies the divine plan of salvation, which confounds all knowledge of the philosopher. Christ crucified is exalted by the power of God – the same power that underlies Paul's preaching. The Apostles' own weakness mirrors that of Christ; his proclamation can bring people to faith, not because of the speaker's persuasiveness, but because God freely bestows it. This is one of Paul's central convictions: redemption in Christ results not from any human action but from divine graciousness – more powerful than all human effort.
