

Sacramental Life

For the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time:

In the verses immediately preceding today's passage. God poses a key question to the community that has just returned from exile: What spiritual discipline truly pleases me? God's answer is clear: it is not ritual fasting, but doing justice and tending to the needs of the poor. God requires **positive** action that demonstrates genuine concern for the needy in our midst.

It is our treatment of others that manifests the quality of our relationship with God. Right behaviour makes our light shine like the dawn," an image that connects this text with today's Gospel where Jesus calls his disciples "the light of the world." We are called to become living manifestations of God's love in the same way as Jesus was a living sacrament of God, manifesting divine love by surrendering his very life.

Addressed to the survivors of the exile, Isaiah's words offer hope that the nation can be rebuilt and recover its former glory. Dramatic images of healing, vindication, and God's vigilant solicitude paint a compelling picture of this future. But it will come only "if" they embrace God's justice and mercy. Note that "light" replaces "gloom" not only because of grand gestures, like removing poverty and oppression from society, but also because of small gestures; like retracting our pointed fingers and taming our tongues. God offers a choice: saying no deepens the gloom around us; saying yes makes us living sacraments and transforms our darkness to radiant light,

A weaker man might have sought a stronger argument; but no one has ever accused Paul of being weak. So he takes up the great stumbling block regarding Christianity and makes it the foundation of his argument: yes, the Son of God was crucified, the Messiah came in weakness and vulnerability and endured the ignominy of the Cross. That is Paul's teaching delivered in simple, unadorned language that lacks the sophistication of eloquent oratory, but never lacks the power of truth or the Spirit and the power of God.

Paul chooses to imitate in his own demeanor the "weakness" of his crucified Lord. But Paul's language is metaphorical, for in his life he faced beatings, imprisonment, and even death with great valour. What he means is that his

life and teaching are imbued with the virtue we call "fear of the Lord," a healthy and respectful fear that flows from awareness of God's awesome majesty. Though some contemporary spirituality looks askance at notions of reverential fear, Paul endorses it as a chief means of working out our salvation.

Paul's self-effacement regarding his lack of "plausible words of wisdom" is his way of teaching that human wisdom cannot save us; but the power of the Cross cannot fail.

The Church is a sacrament of Christ who is a sacrament of God. That geometry is unequivocal and its logic makes "epiphany" a perpetual feast. Before anything else, Christian faith is about manifesting Christ and we do it first of all not by what we do but through who we are.

Jesus's words in this text are not equivocal; he does not say we will be light, or that we will be salt "when." Because our Baptism, we are incorporated into Christ and that status makes us salt and light. Our very being is now sacramental and we go forth showing Christ with every breath, for we are his body. A married couple does not strive to become a sacrament of God's love, they are made a sacrament when, in love, they bind themselves to each other. What remains for them is to grow in their ability to show forth God's love for the Church through their ever deepening love for each other. Perhaps Matthew is suggesting that the role of being the light of the world has now passed to the Gentile nations. Understanding and

prizing our status as "salt," "light," and "a City built on a hill" do not exempt us from the responsibility of manifesting who we are. Duties flow from identity, not the other way around. Once we know who we are we begin to intuit what we should do. So, we must not lose our flavour nor hide our light under a basket. And we must do "good deeds" not to glorify ourselves but to glorify God and to cast light onto God's mercy in a way that draws others into deep relationship with him.


