Reflection on the Gospel: (Matthew 5:38-48)

In the opening verse of today's Gospel passage, Jesus echoes divine instruction from Deuteronomy 6:5: those who belong to God's people must love the Lord with all their whole being. A divided heart is not a heart that belongs to God. The verb here translated "serve" implies the service of a slave, and in imperial Rome, slaves belonged wholly to their masters. Jesus does not despise money as such; rather, he teaches that anyone enslaved to wealth cannot belong to God wholeheartedly.

In the remainder of this reading Matthew continues the Sermon on the Mount - Jesus' teaching that fulfills or brings to full growth the Law of Moses. The beginning and end of this section sound as repeated message about priorities, acting as bookends. What lies between contains Jesus' further teaching about the conduct of those who follow God wholeheartedly and so share in the Kingdom of Heaven. Too much concern for oneself and one's own life can distract from devotion to God as the supreme value. The word *psyche*, translated "life" can also mean the "self" or "inner being".

Jesus takes note of typical human concerns, thus recognizing them as real needs: food, drink, and clothing. But the important question is one of priorities. The word here translated "anxious" can include a sense of preoccupation with certain things. While physical sustenance and proper clothing are genuine needs, those who love God above all have faith in divine providence. The one who graciously clothes even wild flowers in magnificent raiment can surely be trusted to provide for all human needs. Excessive concern with physical necessities implies lack of trust in God.
