Reflection on the Gospel readings:

Today's Gospel begins by drawing to a close Luke's account of the shepherd's response to the angelic message of a Saviour's birth in Bethlehem. As he often does, Luke stresses joyful response to the Good News, and the shepherds immediately seek out the infant Jesus, telling Mary and Joseph of the heavenly revelation they have received. Mary responds like a woman immersed in her Jewish people's understanding of God's Word; it is to be accepted even if it cannot be understood in the moment. Then slowly with time and reflection, the full meaning of God's Word can reach its full significance.

Mary surrendered to Gabriel's incomprehensible message, and now receives confirmation of his words from a most unlikely source: a band of shepherds, people despised as unclean sinners. Still, she continues to hold all these words in her heart. Trusting even when she cannot yet fully know, she names her son Jesus, which means "God saves." In time, the meaning of that powerful name, the character of her son as the one in whom God acts to save all humankind, will be revealed to her. For their part, the shepherds continue to rejoice, praising God. Luke thus raises up a theme he will repeat often: God has come in Jesus to save, turning first of all to the lowly, the poor, the outcast, and the despised.



For the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God:



The feast is a celebration of Mary's motherhood of Jesus. The English "Mother of God" is a translation of the Latin title Dei Genetrix, which means "She Who Generated God". corresponding Greek title Θεοτόκος (*Theotokos*) means "She Who Gave Birth to God". This title was dogmatically adopted at the First Council of Ephesus (431 AD) as a way to assert that Jesus is God, and that his mother can therefore

be called Mother of God. The title that the January 1st feast celebrates is thus not only Mariological but also Christological.

The Second Vatican Council stated: "Clearly from earliest times the Blessed Virgin is honoured under the title of Mother of God" and at an early stage the Church in Rome celebrated on January 1st a feast that it called the anniversary (Natale) of the Mother of God. When this was overshadowed by the feasts of the Annunciation and the Assumption, adopted from Constantinople at the start of the 7th century, January 1st began to be celebrated simply as the octave day of Christmas, the "eighth day" on which, according to Luke 2:21, the child was circumcised and given the name Jesus.

In the 13th or 14th century, January 1st began to be celebrated in Rome, as the feast of the Circumcision of the Lord and the Octave of the Nativity, while still oriented towards Mary and Christmas, with many prayers, antiphons and responsories glorifying the maternity of Mary. The 1969 revision of the liturgical year and the calendar states: "January 1st, the Octave Day of the Nativity of the Lord, is the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God, and also the commemoration of the conferral of the Most Holy Name of Jesus."

In his Apostolic Letter, Marialis Cultus, Pope Paul VI explained: "This celebration, placed on January 1 ... is meant to commemorate the part played by Mary in this mystery of salvation. It is meant also to exalt the singular dignity which this mystery brings to the "holy Mother...through whom we were found worthy to receive the Author of life." It is likewise a fitting occasion for renewing adoration of the newborn Prince of Peace, for listening once more to the glad tidings of the angels (cf. Lk. 2:14), and for imploring from God, through the Queen of Peace, the supreme gift of peace."
