

Reflection on the Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 6:13 – 15, 17-20

Corinth was an important city in Paul's mission. He probably spent about a year and a half there, and wrote several letters to the Church when he heard about erroneous teaching and immoral behavious occurring in his absence. In today's reading, the problem he addresses is "fornication," porneia, a broad term that can refer to any kind of unlawful sexual activity. In order to move the Corinthians to change their behaviour, Paul begins by trying to change their understanding, specifically their understanding of the body. Throughout the letter, Paul writes repeatedly about the body, "soma," expanding and reinterpreting what body means for one's belief and behaviour. Soma denotes a person as a whole, complex being, and is another way of saying "self." In addition to his explanation regarding sexual immorality, Paul develops the meaning of soma in addressing abuses at the Eucharist, factions, exercise of charisms in the Church, and the denial of the Resurrection.

Many in Corinth seem to have had little regard for the body, either their own or that of another person. In contrast, Paul explains that the human body is made to be in relationship with the Lord – so closely joined to Christ that each person, each *soma*, becomes one Spirit with Him. The body is the temple, a dwelling place of the Holy Spirit. If the Corinthians understand this fundamental identity, then reverence for the body should follow. Rather than defiling the body through sexual immorality, those who are united with Christ glorify God in their bodies.



THIS JANUARY... REPORTS FROM THE STUDY GROUPS

Mondays at 7:30 pm – David, the King by Bishop Barron

In the first session Bishop Barron concentrated on the great spiritual law: "The law of the gift". Although counterintuitive, it is the way of the Spirit. Giving your life away for love increases life within you. You partake in the flow of the divine life. Hence, happiness is found in loving acts.

Thursdays at 1 pm – True Reformers by Christopher Blum

The first session introduced St. Thomas More, great English scholar and statesman, whose integrity to follow his conscience cost him displeasure of King Henry VIII and as a result, martyrdom. "I die the King's good servant, but God's first." – St. Thomas More.

Monday Jan 8th at noon – Viewing the summary talk by Brant Pitre on Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist. We heard about the Bread of the Presence which was in the Tabernacle part of the Temple together with two other holy objects foreshadowing the Trinity. Bread of the Presence was shown to all Jewish men and their families during the feasts of Passover, Pentecost and Tabernacles. At the time of the elevation the priests would say: "Behold, God's love for you!" It was consumed by the High Priest every Sabbath.

We heard about the Greek word *epiousios* that is usually translated as "daily" in the Lord's Prayer, but more truly expresses petition for "super substantial" bread – which is Eucharist.
