NO DAILY MASSES

JANUARY 4 - 20

Reflection on the Second Reading (1 Corinthians 1:1-3):

The Second Reading today might be dismissed as a simple opening greeting to the Christian community at Corinth. But while the Apostle Paul does use a conventional Greek form to open his letter, he makes several adaptations that serve important purposes. The usual form included naming writer and recipient, and offering good wishes. With a few additions and wordplay, Paul expands the greeting to express his faith in Christ and to preview several matters he will discuss in the rest of the letter. His additions signal several matters of importance addressed in readings over the next six Sunday Masses.

Paul addresses his hearers specifically at the ekklesia (Church) of God in Corinth. This word primarily indicates an assembly, a community of believers. Word has reached Paul that factions have emerged in the Corinthian Church, Factions that he will later address quire sternly. Here, he indicates why such divisions are unworthy of any group that bears the name ekklesia: Its members have been made holy in Christ and are indeed called to be holy. The Greek term here, translated "sanctified" and "saints," most fundamentally means to be called or set apart by God, for God. The call comes from God, the Father of Christ, and of those who believe in Him. By grace, all Christians have received the gift of God's saving love; one Father, one call, and one gift of God must be the fount and goal of their life together. Paul ends his greeting by wishing his hearers "grace" and "peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ," reminding them of both source and aim of their oneness as a genuine "Church".


