For the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time:

(From the Gospel of John 2:1-12) John opens this passage with the phrase, "on the third day." That cryptic designation, which both evokes the "first day" and the "Resurrection," signals that we should expect the unexpected, and we're not disappointed. The wine was running out and Mary takes the matter to her son, who seems reluctant to inaugurate his messianic mission. Only twice does Jesus address his mother as "woman:" here at the start of his ministry and from the Cross on Calvary when it ends. We can't determine whether Mary's request changed Jesus' mind about when to initiate his public ministry, but Mary doesn't hear a "no" in his response and boldly instructs the waiters to heed his instructions.

From Mary we may see a desire to spare the groom's family, responsible for providing wine, of this unique embarrassment, but this gospel author always has a theological lesson behind the plot. When Jesus uses the water reserved for Jewish ceremonial washings to transform into wine, he shifts focus from ritual to the heart of the Gospel. Rather than slavish ties to rubrics of the old Law, Jesus introduces his disciples to the superabundance of God's grace and the freedom of God's Kingdom.

Mary's words to the servants – the last she speaks in all the Gospel accounts – echo down the centuries as sage advice to all who would be her son's disciples. This event transcends Jesus' other miracles to become one of John's seven signs that manifest the glory and power of Jesus and God's Kingdom.
