#### For the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time:

The second reading is taken from the First Letter to the Corinthians. Paul responds to one of the slogans heard among the community members in Corinth: "All things are lawful for me" (6.12). Clearly, some in the community have misunderstood his teaching, probably concerning the newfound freedom in Christ. Now he hastens to correct this, laying out his position on sexual morality.

Paul counters the notion of everything being lawful by presenting his theology of the body. He is consistent in his theological framework oriented to Christ; the connection of the body of the individual believer with the body of Christ: "Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ?" Here Paul issues the strong order: "Shun fornication!" Paul views our physical bodies as "a temple of the Holy Spirit within vou," owned, in fact, by God and meant to "glorify God."

In the Gospel of John's reading we hear first spoken words of Jesus recorded in that Gospel: "What are you looking for?" They are directed to John and Andrew, the first disciples. They are both an invitation and a challenge. They set the stage for one of the main ways how John defines discipleship: those who bring others to Christ to see and believe the revelation that Jesus is "the Word made flesh".

JANUARY 18 - 25 - THE WEEK OF PRAYER FOR **CHRISTIAN UNITY.** This octave—first proposed by Fr. Paul Wattson in 1908—begins with the Feast of the Confession of St. Peter and ends with the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul. By finding ways to pray together during this week, we join with all people around the world who are praying, reflecting, studying for Christian unity. 

What is the difference between a solemnity, a feast and a <u>memorial?</u> The difference between the three basic categories resides in their importance, which in turn is reflected in the presence or absence of different liturgical elements.

A feast honors a mystery or title of the Lord, of Our Lady, or of saints of particular importance (such as the apostles and Evangelists) and some of historical importance such as the deacon St. Lawrence.

The feast usually has some proper prayers but has only two readings plus the Gloria. Feasts of the Lord, such as the Transfiguration and Exaltation of the Holy Cross, unlike other feasts, are celebrated when they fall on a Sunday. On such occasions they have three readings, the Gloria and the Creed. – Fr. Edward McNamara, professor of liturgy at the Regina Apostolorum University. To be continued.
