Reflection on the First Reading: Deuteronomy 18:15-20

Throughout the Torah, Moses is the leader chosen by God to bring people out of Egypt and to communicate God's Law to them. Besides being the leader and lawgiver, Moses is a Prophet. What are essential characteristics of a prophet:

- a prophet is raised up by God (unlike any other offices or positions),
- a prophet is independent of institutions (such as kingship, or priesthood),
- prophet might seem to be an outsider, a lonely voice challenging accepted practices, or ways of thinking,
- a prophet speaks God's words, and not his or her own.

One of Moses' prophecies was that God will raise up for the People of Israel another prophet, among their own kin, as requested by them at Horeb.

God did repeatedly send Prophets like Moses through salvation history. The greatest fulfillment of this promise was found in Jesus, who not only communicated God's word so perfectly that He was himself the Word made flesh.



St. Blaise (died in 316 AD) - Patron Saint of throat illnesses, animals, wool comber and wool trading. He was a bishop of Sebastea (city in current day central Turkey). Saint Blaise is often depicted holding two crossed candles in his hand (which are used for throat blessing on his feast day), or in a cave with wild animals. He is also often shown with steel combs. The similarity of the steel combs and the

wool combs made a large contribution to Saint Blaise's leadership as the patron saint of wool combers and the wool trade. He was arrested and martyred for being a Christian by Agricola, governor of Cappadocia and of Lesser Armenia.

THIS JANUARY... REPORTS FROM THE STUDY GROUPS

Mondays at 7:30 pm – David, the King by Bishop Barron

"In the third session, Bishop Barron summarized the story of Samuel and Saul. The people of Israel offended God by asking for a king. They had God as their king, but wanted an earthly king. Scripture sees kingship as good in itself, the question to ask any given king (or any form of government) is whether he is trying to *replace* God or *serve* God. "Samuel warned the people of consequences of having an earthly king which included taxation, conscription and slavery."

Thursdays at 1 pm – *True Reformers* by Christopher Blum

The third session introduced Philip Neri (1515 – 1595), the apostle of love and joy. His heart was so big, he received permission to wear an open collar as part of his clerical clothes. He devoted himself to street children of Rome and started the Congregation of the Priests of the Oratory. Philip's rule for the priests was simple - share a common table and perform spiritual exercises. Philip didn't want his followers to bind themselves to the life with a vow and he did not want them to denounce their property.

Monday Jan 21th at Lunch and Learn – We started reading and discussing a new book: "The Mass of the Early Christians" by Mike Aquilina and looking at the names and structure of Mass during the first century after Christ.
