### For The Epiphany of The Lord:

On this celebration of Christ's manifestation to all the world, the First Reading brims with light, brightness, radiance, and glory. This passage comes from the last section of Isaiah, most likely written about the time of Judah's release from exile in Babylon and the return to the homeland in Palestine. The Prophet looks forward to the fulfilment of divine promises to re-create the covenant people, the city of Zion, and God's dwelling place among them. Repeatedly, Isaiah stresses that God's act of restoration will be witnessed by foreign nations, who will thus recognize the saving work of the Lord.

Twice in the first two verses of today's reading, Isaiah uses the Hebrew word kabod, translated "glory." This significant term indicates an outward manifestation of divine presence, at times nearly equivalent to God himself. The earlier Prophet Ezekiel, a Jerusalem priest taken to Babylon with the first wave of exiles, saw a vision of the glory of the Lord leaving the Temple, a certain sign that Judah's final desolation had begun. Isaiah now announces that not only will the Lord's people return to their land, but more importantly, the "glory" of God will again dwell in their midst in a new Temple, in a new Jerusalem. The Prophet further proclaims that the radiance of the Lord's saving act will be the marvel of other nations and their rulers. The Lord will again gather together a scattered people, drawing those from foreign lands to praise the God of Israel.

In the Gospel Reading, Matthew relates the encounter between the three wise men and king Herod. While many debated the exact character of the wise men, what is more important is that they come "from the East," indicating that they are Gentiles. These foreigners are the first to pay homage to the infant "king of the Jews." Like most in the ancient world, the wise men understood the appearance of the great star to signal a ruler's birth. The evangelist also alludes to Balaam's oracle that "a star shall come out of Jacob." Giving a reason for the child's birth in tiny Bethlehem, Matthew quotes Micah 5:2, which states that Israel's messianic ruler will come from this town of David's birth. The guiding star leads the wise men to the infant and his mother, and these Gentiles from a far country prostrate themselves before the true King of the Jews, Jesus the Messiah. Matthew makes apparent that God, not Rome, has designated Israel's true Messiah-King, and that though he first appears among the Jews, Gentiles also welcome the revelation of their true ruler.

Christmas season comes to an end next Sunday with the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord. As the Christmas decorations come down some people write the following on their front doors with a chalk that was blessed for the occasion on the feast of the Epiphany.

$$20 * C + M + B + 16$$

A key to the code:

- The '\*' symbolizes the star that led the wise men to Jesus.
- The letters 'C', 'M', and 'B' signify the Wise Men, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. They are also the first three letters of the Latin phrase 'Christus mansionem benedicat' which means 'May Christ Bless the house'.
- The three crosses signify the Holy Trinity made known to us through the Incarnation.
- Encompassing them all is the year we have just entered into: '2016'. It is a nice devotion for Epiphany great for families and is an active reminder for us through the year of the wonder of Christmas. (Pieces of the blessed chalk will be available at the back of the church.)
