FOR THE 11TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:

(2 Samuel 12:7-10, 13–1st Reading)

David: shepherd, psalmist, warrior, king, adulterer, and murderer, and the only person in the Bible of whom God said, "a man after my heart" (Acts 13:22). David did not earn his distinction because of righteousness. He had sins aplenty, but his saving grace was his reverence. He had great respect for God and understood fear of the Lord. Despite the great sin recounted here, he walked by the light of God and never forgot who his shepherd was. A man after God's heart is not a perfect person. When Samuel anointed David king, God told him not to judge from outward appearance, because "the Lord looks on the heart" (1Samuel 16:7).

We will see in today's Gospel passage that it's hearts that God cares about most, not our number of sins or good deeds. What distinguishes David's heart was his dependency on the Lord. Like a child toward its parents, David was always aware of his need for God. Most of all, David's was a repentant heart. When confronted with his sin David didn't despair like King Saul who threw himself upon his sword. David understood the nature of his sin; he realized he had betrayed the Lord; he truly repented and accepted the consequences of his sin.

The Prophet Nathan reviews for David what the Lord has done for him. It's not a long litany, because David has never lost reliance on God. The Lord doesn't hold back in characterizing David's crime: "you have despised the word of the Lord," he says. David used "the sword of the Ammonites" to do his dirty work when he gave orders that Uriah should be put in the front lines of the battle against the Ammonites and then abandoned. This he did to hide his adultery with Uriah's wife, Bathsheba. Nathan pronounces God's judgement on David: his reign and those of his descendants will be marked by violence. David realizes that these consequences are

entirely of his own doing. He admits not only that he has sinned but that he has sinned so gravely. His honest admission is met by God's merciful response: "You shall not die."

In the Gospel reading we meet another repentant sinner, a woman who washes Jesus' feet with her tears and dries them with her hair. Jesus welcomed her tears and her touch. We might be tempted to conclude that sinners have an advantage over the righteous because the forgiveness of their greater sins produces greater love. The formula, however is not that simple. There were many sinners in this town, but only this woman fell at Jesus's feet. We remain agents in our own destiny. With Pope Francis we must remember that "God never tires of forgiving; it is we who tire of asking for forgiveness." And lest those of us who strive to do our best loose heart, let's not forget that no matter what, each of us is sinner enough to respond to God's mercy with abundant love.
