St. Aloysius de Gonzaga, S.J. (9 March 1568 – 21 June 1591) was an Italian aristocrat who became a member of the Society of Jesus. As an eldest son he was expected by his father to become a soldier, but from the young age he was more interested in being a missionary. While still a

student at the Roman College, he died as a result of caring for the victims of a serious epidemic. He was beatified in 1605 and canonized in 1726. He is a Patron Saint of Young students, Christian youth, Jesuit scholastics, the blind, AIDS patients, AIDS care-givers.

Nativity of St. John the Baptist – Usually it is the date of the death (as a birth to eternal life) that is chosen for a saint's feast day. There are only two exceptions: John the Baptist and Mary, Mother of God. On June 24th we celebrate the birth and on Aug. 29th the death (through beheading) of John the Baptist. We know from the Scripture that he was born 6 months before Jesus to Elizabeth and Zacharias and that his life was preparation for the coming of Jesus. Jesus said about his cousin John: "Truly I tell you, among those born of women no one has arisen greater than John the Baptist" (Mat. 11:11). John, in turn, recognizing who Jesus truly was, said "I am not worthy to untie the thong of His sandals" (Luke 3:16).

The question would naturally arise as to why the celebration falls on June 24 rather than June 25 if the date is to be precisely six months before Christmas. It has often been claimed that the Church authorities wanting to Christianize the pagan solstice celebrations for this reason advanced St. John's feast as a substitute. This explanation is questionable because in the Middle Ages the solstice took place around the middle of June due to the inaccuracy of the Julian calendar. It was only in 1582, through the Gregorian calendar reform, that the solstice returned to June 21 as it had been in the fourth century.

Therefore, a more likely reason why the festival falls on June 24 lies in the Roman way of counting, which proceeded backward from the Kalends (first day) of the succeeding month. Christmas was "the eighth day before the Kalends of January". Consequently, Saint John's Nativity was put on the "eighth day

before the Kalends of July." However, since June has only thirty days, in our present way of counting, the feast falls on June 24.

Nevertheless, the fact of the feast falling around the time of the solstice is considered to be significant, recalling the words of John the Baptist with regard to Jesus: "He must increase, but I must decrease" (John 3:30).
