FOR THE 12TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:

(Luke 9:18-24 - Gospel)

Jesus has managed to avoid crowds and find a quiet place for prayer. Luke depicts Jesus at prayer prior to significant moments in His history. Here we have two significant events: Peter's confession and Jesus' first prediction of His Passion.

Emerging from prayer time, Jesus asks about the crowd's opinion of Him. Whether or not He already knew what the throng was speculating, it's likely that His real interest is in the disciples; perception of who He is. In His meditation, He may have prayed about the approaching menace of His suffering and Death and sensed, perhaps, the great threat to the disciples' faith that would represent. Prior to that fateful moment, they would need a strong grasp on His identity or they might be scattered forever.

Peter's reply constitutes the bedrock moment. Jesus can tell the disciples about the trials to come with confidence that that knowledge won't compromise their understanding of who He is. He can even require that they daily take up their own crosses in order to imitate Him, thus acquiring all by suffering all. Note that Luke adds "daily" to counter the impression that disciples would soon suffer and die.


