Reflection on the First Reading (Acts 1:1-11)

The account of the Ascension of Jesus is the hinge whereby Luke connects the story of Jesus in his Gospel to the story of the Church in Acts. The two volumes overlap, with a narrative of the Ascension concluding the Gospel, and told again at the beginning of Acts. In the version in Acts, Jesus' disciples, confused and anxious, question him about the restoration of the kingdom of Israel. Telling them that it isn't for them to know such mysteries, he speaks instead of what they are to do through the power of the Holy Spirit. In one succinct sentence, he gives them their commission, phrased as both a command and promise. Jesus promises that the Holy Spirit, whose power had filled Jesus through his lifetime, will also empower and sustain their mission. The Spirit will impel the disciples beyond their fear and lack of understanding to become Jesus' own witnesses (martyroi). As witnesses, they will testify to Jesus by preaching and healing in his name, and even by emulating his faithfulness to God in the face of persecution. As Jews, Jesus' disciples would likely expect to carry out their mission in Jerusalem, among their own people. But Jesus sends them to witness also to Samaritans and even to Gentiles, those who dwell at the ends of the earth. The short sentence provides an outline for the deeds of the apostles throughout Acts.

After giving them the final instruction, Jesus is lifted from their sight. His Ascension is part of the saving action that extends from his death and resurrection to his ascending to his Father. The disciples, not yet filled with the promised Holy Spirit, seem dazed and immobile. The two men in white garments, evocative of the heavenly messengers at the empty tomb on Easter morning, announce that the place of Jesus; Ascension will also be the place of his return. Until that happens, his disciples have their mission to fulfill.


No Daily Masses this week, as Fr. Phil is away on a retreat.


