FOR THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT:

The Parable of the Prodigal Son teaches us much about the Christian life. There is no one who doesn't need to rely on God's mercy. Even the older brother is a prodigal son who finds his own, more subtle way, of leaving the father for the far country of righteousness and resentment.

Families – The Skoog Family

It is the forgiving, unconditionally loving father who gets most of the attention. This father depicts so well the reality of God's love. We cannot exhaust the mercy of God and we can rely on God to be the loving Father. Can we, however, rely on ourselves to be as bold and humble as the prodigal son, to pick ourselves up and find our way back home? From the elder son we learn it's possible to lose willingness to return, our knowledge of the way back home. Had he not been willing to turn around and admit his failure, the younger boy would not have experienced the father's forgiveness. Yes, we can count on God's constancy, but our willingness to act like the courageous, brutally honest prodigal is not assured. That awareness, and the contrition it engenders, are gifts from God that we might or might not accept.

The elder brother takes the stage just when the drama ought to end. The dialogue between father and son adds greatly to this story and reinforces a central message of the parable: the love of the father cannot penetrate a heart unwilling to receive it. We never learn of the elder boy's decision. Is it possible he spends the night in a den of anger rather than feasting with father, brother and friends?

As the elder, angry brother was entitled to a double share of the estate which was in fact set aside for him when the younger demanded his smaller portion. Customarily, a father deeded property to his sons and then collected rent until his death. The father reminds the elder of this when he says, "all that is mine is yours." Note that in both instances, it is the

father who goes out to the sons. With the younger, the sight of the boy brings him running; with the elder, his absence sparks the father's initiative. The father is ever ready, but the crucial question is, are we?

Today is Laetare Sunday, a Lenten day of rejoicing in the midst of our penitential journey toward the triumph of Easter. We rejoice because like the Israelites in the first reading we realize that God has given us the means to live like adults, taking responsibility for our action, making our home in God and the land of his promise.
