Reflection on the Reading from Acts 6: 1-7

As the Christian community in Jerusalem grew, it incorporated people of different backgrounds. Not yet distinct from Judaism, Jesus' followers were considered one of several Jewish sects of the time. In this passage, Hellenists were Jews who spoke only Greek, while Hebrews were Jews who most commonly spoke Aramaic. As today, language differences sometimes led to perceived differences in treatment, and the Greek –speaking Jewish Christians protested that their widows were often ignored in the community's distribution to the needy.

Up to this point, the Twelve had served as leaders of the new Israel of the final age. The Hellenists' complaint seemed to require the aid of leaders who could communicate in Greek and so more easily assist them. The Twelve, who had focused on proclaiming the Good News, did not want to surrender this important work. Therefore, the Twelve call for a new group of leaders among the Hellenists who will carry out this ministry, allowing the Twelve to continue preaching the Gospel.

The community finds this an acceptable division of labour, and so chooses seven men who meet the necessary requirements for Christian ministry: faithful disciples "full of faith and the Holy Spirit." The names of the seven (a "perfect" number symbolizing complete suitability for the task) are all Greek, indicating that they can well serve the Hellenist members of the community. Stephen, named first, will later become a prominent leader and eventually the first Christian martyr. Luke concludes the episode by focusing again on a favoured there: rapid multiplication of believers in Jesus the Messiah.




