Reflection on the Reading from Acts 1:1-11

In the final scene of Luke's Gospel, just before Jesus' Ascension, he commissions his gathered disciples, sending them out to all nations. The scene at the beginning of Acts provides a brief summary of that commissioning, focusing on three essential elements: the disciples are to be Jesus' witnesses; they are to take the Gospel to the ends of the earth; and they do so in the dynamist of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus says that the apostolic task is to be "my witnesses," with "my" embracing a two-fold meaning: they will belong to Jesus and they will give testimony about him. As witnesses, they not only give verbal testimony, but they also repeat in their own lives the pattern of Jesus, the one to whom they belong.

We can hear Jesus' words both as a clear command and as an assured promise, since the command he gives his followers will be accomplished by the promised gift of the Holy Spirit. The very breath of God, the Holy Spirit, is the abiding presence of God throughout the entire book of Acts. In fact, the book could appropriately be names "Acts of the Holy Spirit," for the Spirit is the one who empowers everyone in the Church to carry out the mission that Jesus gives.

Jesus' Ascension, which Luke describes as his being "lifted up," is the necessary condition for the sending of the Spirit. Only after Jesus is lifted up, exalted into heaven, and no longer physically present in earth can his Spirit be poured out onto his disciples. Then, in the power of the Spirit, Jesus' disciples are witnesses – first in Jerusalem and then to the ends of the earth. Jesus' Ascension, more than a scene of departure, is one filled with hope, promise, and fulfillment.
